Overcoming the Unknown, the FOCUS Way

As Marines, we faced many circumstances that were unforeseen. It was impossible to prepare for every possibility so there were 4 constants embedded in every Marine to help them battle the stress and fear created by unknowns. These were Discipline, Identity, Esprit de Corps, and Training. "Discipline is the hallmark of Marines." That phrase is stated to Recruits on their 1st day of training. It is instilled and reinforced every day thereafter. The result is a man or woman who remains in control when a lack of restraint is the easiest thing to do. This ability to retain the power over one's own actions creates a sense of control and empowerment, and a feeling that you are in control of the events around you, not the other way around.

While discipline is difficult, especially in turbulent times, it is an almost passive activity without the Marine identity. Discipline alone would result in restraint more than achievement. It is the identity that guides the actions that follow. Integrity compels us to honestly evaluate the situation and initiative guides us to solve it rather than be manipulated by outside events. Honor requires us to treat others fairly despite a lack of reciprocation. Discipline got the Marines ashore at Iwo Jima. Identity got them up Mount Suribachi.

Esprit de Corps is our shared identity. It fuels our commitment. It is an awareness that my shortcomings are our problem and my successes are our victories. Draw upon the strength of Marines past and present for inspiration when you are in need of encouragement and motivate others when you flourish. Your deeds will determine the quality of the road for those that will follow you. Our employers, neighbors and friends will judge other Veterans based on their interactions with us. Turn that burden into positive energy to combat fatigue and discouragement.

The unknown exists outside our comfort zones. It is a place that creates anxiety, stress and fear. It is also a place that illustrates "The Stability Myth." The anxiety of the unknown creates a scenario where we must either grow or decay, move forward or retreat. Growth is training and requires security in failure. If we are not making mistakes, our training is too easy and we are still in our comfort zones. Confronting the unknown will result in failures and mistakes. Don't fear them. Embrace them. Learn from them. Grow from them.

So, fellow Marines, graduates, mentors, team leaders, volunteers, and all others in the FOCUS Marines Foundation family, face the unknowns of our future the Marine way, the FOCUS way. Don't let unforeseen events control you. Confront them with honor, integrity, and initiative. Share your success with your brothers and let their strength inspire you through difficulty. Most importantly, remember that you are either growing or decaying. Continue to grow. Semper Fi.

Continuing to Inspire Today's Marines

Harry Hope served with 3/7 during the Korean War. The 7th Regiment led the march for the First Marine Division to the Reservoir and fought off a significant Chinese attempt to halt the column. The Marines sustained numerous casualties but ultimately beat them back. On November 15, 1950, the Marines reached the southern end of the reservoir at the town of Hagaru-ri. A few days later, they occupied the town of Yudam-ni. On the night of November 27, Harry's outfit was attacked by tens of thousands of Chinese Communist troops cutting them off from any reinforcements. Three days later, Harry's unit had to fight their way back to Hagaru-ri. For 10 more days, the Marines made their way south toward the coast, suffering more casualties and capturing numerous Chinese prisoners. The enemy soldiers suffered tens of thousands of casualties from combat with the First Marine Division and the harsh weather conditions where temperatures reached 35 below zero. Of the 25,000 Americans who began the march toward the reservoir weeks earlier, nearly 13,000 became casualties. Of those, 7,300 fell victim to the cold with frostbite and hypothermia. 200 Marines were missing in action.

Harry suffered severe frostbite, nearly losing his feet and lower legs. He still has trouble walking. His desire to make the Marine Corps his career was thwarted because of those injuries. Harry shares with our FOCUS participants his Korean War experiences, the struggles he endured following the war, and how he overcame those struggles. Our participants find strength in his words as they relate them to their own stories.

We are honored to have Harry and his wife, Terri, as part of the FOCUS Family. You are both inspirations to us all.
